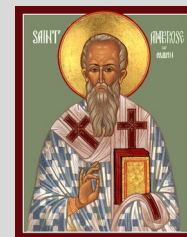

Dear Parishioners,

We need compassion in our communal dialogue. The issues facing the human person are diverse and challenging but we must always face them as true disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ,
